A Decade of Struggling for Justice in Louisiana



The book depicts in vivid detail the kind of local work that transformed the Old South. In a blend of grassroots history and memoir, Rothschild tells story after story of confronting injustice. His accounts bring to life a world that, while still recognizable, no longer exists as it did when he began his volunteer work for the ACLU of Louisiana in 1966.

Herbert Rothschild Jr. has made his home in the Rogue Valley since 2009. He continued his life-long work for justice and peace by chairing Peace House in Ashland from 2012-2015. When Ashland lost its daily newspaper in 2021, he helped found Ashland.news. His weekly column, which the Daily Tidings began publishing in 2014, now appears there every Friday.
